SECURITY MATTERS

HIGH HOLIDAYS SECURITY PROCEDURES

- When entering and exiting Shaarei Shomayim, please cooperate with instructions and requests of the security guards and police.
- Shaarei Shomayim is private property. All persons and belongings are subject to a search. Entry may be denied if consent is not provided.
- Please have your ticket ready to show all security personnel.
- Entrance and exit will be through the North and South doors only.
- Please refrain from distracting volunteers, employees, and security personnel.
- Greet unfamiliar guests and offer your assistance.
- Children should be with parents, in a minyan or in a youth program.
- Please be aware of your surroundings at all times. If you see something suspicious, please report it immediately.
- Report suspicious cars, persons, bags or parcels to a security guard. DO NOT open unattended bags.
- Shaarei Shomayim has procedures in place to call 911 in the case of an emergency.
- Follow instructions of volunteers, facilities crew, security guards and police.
- Immediately evacuate the building in the event of a physical threat or attack. Run and take cover. Plan ahead to meet your family at an agreed upon secure location away from the shul vicinity.
- DO NOT pull the fire alarm in the event of a threat or attack.
- In the event of a fire alarm, follow posted emergency evacuation procedures. Children in youth programs will be evacuated by youth leaders.
- Do not congregate near the entry doors or fire lane.
- Do not re-enter until the all-clear signal is given by security personnel or shul leadership.
- In the event of a medical emergency, notify the designated physician, Dr. Gili Rosen. Procedures are in place to call and direct first responders. Stand back and allow first responders to treat the patient. Keep hallways and access points clear.
